Where do you live?

You will have to consider how busy the road outside your home is. For the safety of our cats, we can't rehome to a property on a known busy road or near a railway track. We will look at the location of your home to see if the area is suitable for the cat you wish to rehome and the level of traffic the cat is used to. We will, on occasion recommend you take an indoor only cat if we have any looking for a home.

Can you afford a cat?

Take in to consideration food, toys, equipment, litter and vet bills. Will you take out insurance which will be an additional monthly cost. We recommend insuring any pet and we will offer you 4 weeks' free Pet Plan insurance when you rehome from us.

Do you have children?



If you do have children it is important that the children know how to behave around a cat and understand they will need time and space to settle. We assess the temperament of all our cats and sometimes we feel homes with children would not be best for certain cats.

Think about the age of cat

Yes kittens are cute, but they grow up and are not kittens forever. Please consider taking on a adult or even senior cat. Often older cats can more suitable to some households rather than a kitten

Are you house proud?

Cats like to scratch things and can shed a lot of fur. If you have furniture you really don't want damaged, you may want to consider if the cat has access to the room the furniture is in. We also suggest investing in a good vacuum cleaner
